PUBLIC INTEREST VOTES

- 1. Identity Theft, SB 20:** If signed, this measure would have required companies that lose their customers' information to provide more detail about what information was stolen, to help consumers avoid identity theft.
- 2. Safe Baby Bottles, SB 797:** If passed, this measure would have banned the toxic chemical bisphenol A, which is linked to developmental problems and cancer, from children's products including baby bottles.
- 3. Mortgage Reform, SB 94:** This law will prohibit charging consumers up front to modify their home loan, which has become a common scam.
- 4. Product Safety, SB 550:** If passed, this measure would have required grocery stores to program their checkout scanners to notify the cashier if a customer is purchasing a product subject to a recall.
- 5. Consumer Protection, SB 340:** This law will require products with free trial offers and monthly subscriptions to notify consumers before charges start, and give them an opportunity to opt out of the charges.
- 6. Mortgage Reform, AB 260:** This CALPIRG-sponsored law will protect consumers from many of the deceptive lending products that caused the foreclosure crisis. The law requires brokers to act in their clients' best interest, and removes the incentive to cheat borrowers.
- 7. Health Insurance Reform, AB 2:** If passed, this measure would have prohibited insurers from retroactively rescinding health coverage.
- 8. Health Insurer Efficiency, SB 316:** If passed, this measure would have required insurers to spend at least 85 cents out of every premium dollar on patient care.
- 9. Nuclear Safety, AB 42:** This law will require Pacific Gas & Electric to conduct a seismic study of a recently discovered earthquake fault underneath Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant.
- 10. Voter Registration, AB 30:** This new law will allow 17-year-old Californians to pre-register to vote, encouraging new voter participation.
- 11. Loan Modification, AB X 2-7:** This law will push lenders to create loan modification programs for their clients who are in danger of foreclosure, and puts a hold on foreclosures for 90 days unless the lender can show that they have a loan modification program in place and running.
- 12. Financial Privacy, AB 943:** If signed, this measure would have made it illegal for employers to base a hiring decision on an applicant's credit history.
- 13. Loan Modification SB X 2-7:** This law will push lenders to create loan modification programs for their clients who are in danger of foreclosure.

PUBLIC INTEREST VOTES

1. Mortgage reform, AB 260: This CALPIRG-sponsored law will protect consumers from many of the deceptive lending products that caused the foreclosure crisis. The law requires brokers to act in their clients' best interest, and removes the incentive to cheat borrowers.

2. Health Insurance Reform, AB 786: If passed, this measure would have made it easier for consumers to compare prices in California's individual health insurance marketplace.

3. Health Care Reform, AB 2: If passed, this measure would have prohibited insurers from retroactively rescinding health coverage.

4. Health Care Reform, AB 542: If passed, this measure would have prevented hospitals from charging patients for treatments needed to fix medical errors.

5. Nuclear Safety, AB 42: This law will require Pacific Gas & Electric to conduct a seismic study of a recently discovered earthquake fault underneath Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant.
